

GIFT the library

Your donation to the library will be matched by the Lilly Endowment from now through March 31

In 1993, the Wells County Public Library established an endowment fund with the Wells County Foundation that has grown over the last 21 years through generous donations from board members, patrons, organizations, and annual dividends earned on the Foundation's investments. The library has access to the income earned by the endowment to use for unusual or unexpected needs, such as electronic signage that was purchased during the recent building projects at both the Main Library and Ossian Branch. The dividends will also sustain worthwhile, long-term initiatives such as the 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten program.

Anyone can donate to the library's Endowment Fund at anytime, however, it's never been a better time than now. The Lilly Endowment recently announced a matching funds opportunity as part of their GIFT (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow) initiative that has been growing and developing Indiana's community foundations for more than 25 years. From now through March 31, 2015 any gifts given to the Wells County Public Library's Endowment Fund at the Wells County Foundation will be matched (50 cents on the dollar; up to \$10,000) by the Lilly Endowment as part of the GIFT Phase VI initiative. A \$1 gift can become a \$1.50 benefit to the library. That \$20 gift may become \$30, and a \$100 gift would be a \$150 benefit.

If you'd like to participate in helping grow the library's endowment fund, just stop by the Main Library and Ossian Branch or print out a GIFT the Library form (available at www.wellscolibrary.org/index.php/blog/qift-library) and mail to the library.

Just for donating, you'll get to write your name on a snowflake and help us fill in our "snowman" as a way to encourage others to donate and help the community reach our goal together of creating more funds the library can use for long-term growth.



With the flu and cold season here, you may be looking for health information. Two reliable websites are www.medlineplus.gov and www.nihseniorhealth.gov. Both websites are part of the National Institutes of Health (NIH).

Medlineplus.gov is for patients, their families, and their friends. The website has information on conditions and diseases, prescriptions, and over-the-counter medicines. There are also videos and tutorials on anatomy, surgical procedures, and healthy living, plus much more.

The NIHSeniorHealth.gov website is easy to navigate and provides readable and understandable information. The print is large type but there is a "talking" function that will read the text aloud. One section has information on numerous topics, such as: Alzheimer's disease, shingles, and glaucoma. Another section has senior citizens talking about the benefits of their exercise routines.






