





Got a Small Engine to Repair?

WCPL can help you tune-up for spring by accessing the Small Engine Repair Reference Center database through our website. Although the database has several sections on a variety of small engines, such as lawn mowers, motorcycles, and generators, it also has a section on tractors.

The Tractors section has repair information for Allis-Chalmers, Ford, John Deere, Kubota, and many more. Under each brand name is a list of models and under each model name lists various categories, such as: brakes, cooling systems, electrical systems, and transmissions. The Hydraulics Information section has articles in three categories: Farm Equipment Electrical Systems, Hydraulic Systems Diagnosis, and Let's Get into Hydraulics. The Farm Equipment Electrical Systems section, contains helpful articles on various circuits, diagnosing issues, and testing. The Let's Get into Hydraulics section covers the different parts, such as: pumps, cylinders, valves, lines, etc.

To access this helpful database, go to the Wells County Public Library home page at www.wellscolibrary.org, click on "Research" and then select the "Small Engine Repair Reference Center." The variety and amount of information is amazing that is available free to our patrons.






