We walk through the great hall at Hogwarts, ride a broomstick through London, and take a peek into the dormitories! Once we've had our fill, we transfer to





Oxford for a group meal at the famous Eagle and Child Pub, where literary greats such as JRR Tolkien and CS Lewis once met and discussed their writing. **B,D**

Day 4: Friday, May 3, 2019 • Gloucester


After breakfast at the hotel, we tour the Bodleian Library and Christchurch College with many Harry Potter, Alice in Wonderland and Inspector Morse connections. Christchurch also includes Hogwarts Hall and the Hogwarts Trophy Room. We transfer to Stratford-Upon-Avon for a tour of Shakespeare's Birthplace and Anne Hathaway's Cottage. We have some free time before heading to Gloucester for our overnight. B

Day 5: Saturday, May 4, 2019 • Bath

Today we take a leisure drive through the Cotswolds. We stop in Bibury to see the ancient stone cottages of Arlington Row and St. Anne's. We have lunch on our own before we head to Bath where we learn more about Jane Austen and this wonderful town. B

Day 6: Sunday, May 5, 2019 • Exeter

Today we explore the Devon area. This is where Agatha Christie was born and lived part of her life. Some sites we will see is Greenway House in Glampton, Agatha Christie's birthplace, The Torquay Grand Hotel and Beacon Cove. **B**





Day 7: Monday, May 6, 2019 • Winchester

Today we leave the Devonshire area and head to Winchester. Our highlight today is Highclere Castle the site where Downton Abbey is filmed. We spend several hours touring the castle and the gardens. After our time at Highclere Castle* we travel to Winchester, our home for the night. The rest of the day is free to explore the Jane Austen sites Winchester, including her burial place at the Cathedral. **B**

Day 8: Tuesday, May 7, 2019 • London

Today we travel back to London. Our first stop is Chawton, where Jane Austen lived for the last 8 years of her life. We tour her house which has now been turned into a museum. Our next stop is one of Downton Abbey filming location, Basildon Park (also the location of Netherfield from the 2005 Pride and Prejudice Film). After Basildon Park we transfer back to London. **B**

Day 9: Wednesday, May 8, 2019 • London

This morning is spent at your leisure in London. You can do some shopping, additional sightseeing or whatever you please! This afternoon we take a literary pub crawl. The late Charles Dickens (and occasionally the late Virginia Woolf) have agreed to host our tour! It takes in not only the history of literature in London but some of its contemporary places and spaces too and looks at some key elements in our writers' lives. Starting in Fitzrovia, and ending in Soho, our tour also includes those pubs and bars associated with the British Film industry and contemporary writers. So, you never know who you might bump into! We have some free time for dinner before the optional theater show of Agatha Christie's *Mousetrap*. **B**

Payment Schedule:

A deposit of \$500 per person is due with reservation. Deposit deadline is Tuesday, October 30, 2018. Final payment is due 100 days prior to departure date. Invoice will be sent out prior to final payment. Passengers may add after this date subject to air and land availability. Generally airlines do not increase the price of a ticket after it has been contracted. However, prior to the issuance of a ticket, airlines may (and regularly do) impose fuel, tax, or security surcharges. In the event a surcharge is imposed after Ed-Ventures has received a final payment, Ed-Ventures will send an additional invoice for the surcharge amount. Early registration is encouraged.

Currency:

Currency exchange rates fluctuate constantly. In the event of a significant drop in the value of the dollar, we reserve the right to add a currency surcharge to the price of the tour.

Refund/Cancellation Policy:

All cancellations must be in writing. The date of postmark will determine the amount of refund due. Refunds are based on the number of days prior to departure date. From the time of deposit to 99 days before departure a \$100 administrative fee plus any airfare penalties will be assessed. From 99-14 days, a \$300 cancellation penalty plus lost airfare deposits and any unrecoverable deposits to ground suppliers will be assessed. Airline tickets once purchased are nonrefundable. Anyone canceling less than 14 days prior to departure will receive **no refund**.

Purchase of health, baggage, and trip cancellation/interruption insurance is strongly recommended.







Trip Cancellation & Interruption

Trip Cancellation and Interruption pays for forfeited, non-refundable, unused payments or deposits if due to:

- Unforeseen sickness, injury, or death of the insured, a traveling companion, family member, or business partner. (Certain exclusions apply.)
- Inclement weather causing delay or cancellation of travel.
- Strike resulting in the complete cessation of travel services at the point of departure or destination.
- The Insured's primary residence being made uninhabitable or inaccessible by natural disaster, vandalism, or burglary.
- The insured or a traveling companion being subpoenaed, required to serve on jury duty, hijacked, or quarantined.
- A terrorist incident in a city listed on the insured's itinerary within 30 days of the insured's scheduled arrival.
- The insured or a traveling companion is involved in or delayed due to an automobile accident, substantiated by a police report, while en route to the insured's destination.
- The insured or traveling companion is involuntarily terminated or laid off through no fault of his or her own provided that he or she has been an active employee for the same employer for at least 1 year. Termination must occur following the effective date of coverage.



Trip Delay

Reimburses up to \$150 a day for reasonable additional expenses if delayed for 6 hours or more due to:

- Common carrier delay such as mechanical difficulties.
- Lost or stolen passport, money, or travel documents.
- Natural disaster.
- Injury, sickness or quarantine of the insured or traveling companion.



Missed Connection

Reimburses up to the maximum benefit shown on the Schedule of Benefits if delayed for 3 or more hours to your point of departure due to:

- Inclement weather
- Common carrier caused cancellation or delay of all regularly scheduled airline flights.



Baggage & Personal Effects

- Reimburses for loss, theft, and damage of baggage and personal effects .

The company will waive this exclusion if you meet the following conditions:

2.
