One Book One County

All ages: One Book One County is a community read program for Wells County held in September and

October every year. The program is designed to create a countywide discussion by encouraging all residents to read the same book. This year's title is "Frog and Toad Together" by Arnold Lobel.

About the Book: "Frog and Toad are best friends they do everything together. When Toad admires the flowers in Frog's garden, Frog gives him seeds to grow a garden of his own. When Toad bakes cookies, Frog helps him eat them. And when both Frog and Toad are scared, they are brave together." - book jacket

School Library Journal called this story collection from Arnold Lobel "a masterpiece of child-styled humor and sensitivity." Winner of the Newbery Honor award, this classic story about friendship is a Level Two *I Can Read* book that is geared for kids who read on their own but still need a little help.

Summer Reading Recap

Thank you to everyone that participated in our 2024 Summer Reading Program and a special congratulations to our children, teens, and adults that completed the program and helped us reach our community reading goals. With your help, lots of wonderful books were read. Just how many?

- *Birth to 24 months:* 99 of our youngest library patrons completed a total of 1,656 activities.
- *Kids:* 1,357 children ages 2-grade 6 read for 486,720 minutes.
- *Teens:* 260 teen participants in grades 6-12 read 687,284 pages.
- *Adults:* between the 629 adults participating, there were 1,507,706 pages read!
