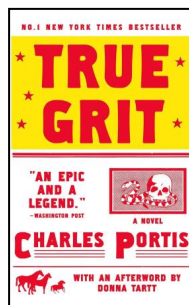


One Book One County



One Book One County

Adults: One Book One County is a community read program for Wells County held in September and October every year. The program is designed to create a countywide discussion by encouraging all residents to read the same book. This year's title is "True Grit" by Charles Portis.

About the Book: "True Grit tells the story of Mattie Ross, who is just fourteen when the coward Tom Chaney shoots her father down in Fort Smith, Arkansas, and robs him of his life, his horse, and \$150 in cash. Mattie leaves home to avenge her father's blood.

With one-eyed Rooster Cogburn, the meanest available U.S. Marshal, by her side, Mattie pursues the killer into Indian Territory. True Grit is eccentric, cool, straight, and unflinching, like Mattie herself.

From a writer of true status, this is an American classic through and through." - *book jacket*

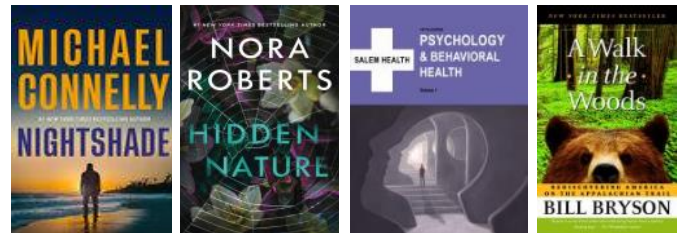

Summer Reading Recap

Thank you to everyone that participated in our 2025 Summer Reading Program and a special congratulations to our children, teens, and adults that completed the program and helped us reach our community reading goals. With your help, lots of wonderful books were read. Just how many?

- *Birth to 24 months*: 122 of our youngest library patrons completed a total of 2,103 activities.
- *Kids*: 1,355 children ages 2-grade 6 read for 489,413 minutes.
- *Teens*: 281 teen participants in grades 6-12 read 711,309 pages.
- *Adults*: between the 588 adults participating, there were 1,399,929 pages read!

Locker Pickup

The library has outdoor lockers outside door 10 at Southern Wells schools and at the Main Library (Bluffton) and the Ossian Branch that can be used to pick up library books and materials at any time of day.

How it Works:

- Go to wellscolibrary.org and search for books and other items. Or simply call the library.
- Click "Place Hold" once you find an item and log in to your account.
- Select either "Southern Wells Outdoor Lockers," "Bluffton Outdoor Lockers," or "Ossian Outdoor Lockers," or as your Pickup Library.
- You'll receive an email, text, or phone call when items are ready for pickup, along with your Locker # (however you are set up to receive notices).
- Pick up your items by using the last four digits of your Library Card # for the locker combo.



Hotspots and Launchpads are not available to be picked up in a locker. Deliveries happen once a week.
